Information for patients with casts








Instructions

- Do not wear any jewellery on the arm and fingers on which is the cast is located. Possible swelling may impair circulation.
- You can bathe or shower with a plastic bag or clear film (plastic food wrap/cling film) over the cast.

Importante Rules

- Elevate legs or arms set in plaster.
- No objects should be shoved under the cast.
- All joints that are not set in plaster must be moved several times daily.
 - Close your fingers into a fist and open them again.
 - Bend your elbow and extend it again.
 - Raise your shoulders and circle them in both directions.
 - Move your toes again and again.
 - Bend your knees and extend them again. Bend at the hips and stretch out again.





Complications

If any of the following signs occurs, contact us immediately (even during the night)!

- If your fingers or toes become cold, turn white or blue and these signs do not go away, even when the limb is elevated.
- If your fingers or toes begin to swell significantly.
- If changes in sensation occur. (Tingling or numbness)
- If non-stop pain occurs at a point under the cast.
- If the cast is too tight or loose.
